Our division's quality improvement group, led by Alex Lo, are looking at what quality improvement projects can be considered for a city-wide initiative. They have taken a very thoughtful approach to selecting possible topics. The group first looked at vitamin D prescriptions, and whether or not physiatrists discharge summaries reach the primary care physician. We are actually doing well in both of these measures and now the group is looking at whether or not we have an accurate way of knowing what medications patients are on when they come to visit us in clinic. This is an important project because having an accurate and up-to-date medication list contributes significantly to patient care and quality and safety. 
